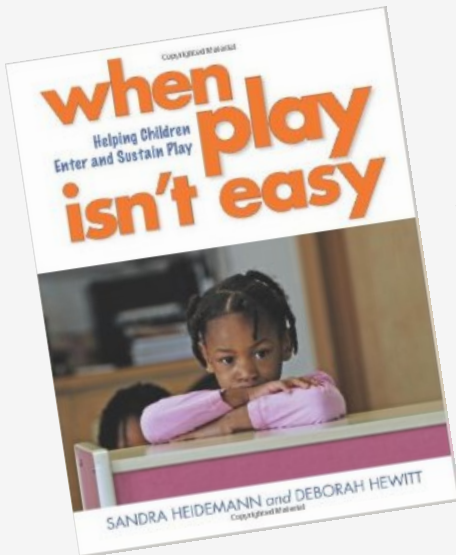
Book Study
