# LLI K-2 Workshop Series for 2015-2016

#### **About LLI:**

LLI is a small group intervention for children in Kindergarten through Grade 2 who find reading and writing difficult to learn. Reading Recovery ® is recommended for the lowest first grade students, and other low students may be serviced through Leveled Literacy Intervention ® in groups of three. In Kindergarten and Grade 2, the children selected for the interventions are the lowest achievers in literacy in their grade level and are not receiving another intervention.

### **Leveled Literacy Intervention Features:**

- Fast-paced lessons that include explicit instruction in phonemics/phonics, vocabulary, fluency, and comprehension
- Daily lesson guides with prescribed sequences of texts
- Instructional interactions between teachers and students with a 3:1 student-teacher ratio
- Emphasis on comprehension of fiction and non- fiction texts with time engaged in reading continuous texts
- Continuum of student understandings to guide the series of lessons
