LEARN WITH LITERACY EXPERTS! DAY 1: JUNE 20 Reading Workshop with Matt Glover and Kathy Collins

Using video and classroom examples, Kathy and Matt will demonstrate how and why children's interactions with any book count as real reading and mark a precious time in their reading lives, whether or not they can read the words. They'll also show the power of viewing children as readers and nurturing what they're doing before they can read conventionally. Gain practical suggestions for helping children develop healthy reading habits and identities, as well as a disposition toward meaning making and joyful engagement with all books. They will share ideas for creating environments that encourage young children to dig into books in authentic, joyful ways.

CONTINUE YOUR LEARNING ON DAY 2: JUNE 21 Writing Workshop with Matt Glover and Lisa Cleaveland

Learn how primary students can learn from professional writers, work with intention, and think about their own process in a writing workshop that is designed to support and respond sensitively to the developmental needs of children in the early grades. Discuss the characteristics of a developmentally appropriate writing workshop and learn procedures for implementing a workshop and managing it throughout the year, including strategies for planning and organizing mini lessons into powerful units of study. Learn the kinds of support young children need to begin thinking like experienced writers, and techniques for conferences and assessment that support and extend children's writing.
