## The Need:

Students with hearing loss have different levels of auditory functioning. Many of these students are able to hear and understand language in individual or quiet settings, and structured classroom activities using listening technology. Yet, several of these students find that listening alone does not meet their needs for access to spoken language for ongoing instructional presentations.

This may be true for students who:

- · use personal hearing aids
- use other listening technology
- · have cochlear implants
- have a progressive hearing loss
- have had a sudden hearing loss

This workshop addresses how the interpretation might look different for students who can hear spoken language AND need visual language support.
