Inclusion is more than a place; it is a process that requires thoughtful planning for and delivery of instruction. Co-teaching is more than assigning two teachers to one classroom and also requires thoughtful planning for successful implementation of the strategy. Special education students are general education students first and the collaboration of expertise from all staff is necessary to improve outcomes for all of our students.

Join us in exploring what effective co-teaching looks like. We will establish a foundation for co-teaching by learning about effective coplanning, high impact instructional strategies in universal curriculum, and the intentional incorporation of specially designed instruction.

Who Should Attend:

- Districts interested in developing co-teaching and co-planning opportunities for their staff are encouraged to participate.
 Co-teaching teams are encouraged to attend.
- Administrators of participating districts are required to attend
 December 15 for a half day workshop establishing the foundation for implementing collaborative partnerships with their staff.
- Administrators will participate free on December 15 and any additional days they attend.
- Teams of teachers will attend four workshop days with on-site coaching provided between workshop dates.

Workshop Dates:

January 11: Teams will define specially designed instruction and explore its delivery in the general education classroom. Additional topics will include assessing student outcomes and aligning college and career ready IEP goals.

February 8 & 9: Teaching teams from districts will learn the foundations of co-teaching. Topics will include understanding what co-teaching is, strategies for successful partnerships, and approaches to co-teaching.

March 14: Teaching teams will learn how co-planning and co-teaching strategies can be used to deliver high impact instructional strategies to all students through universal curriculum.

On-site follow up coaching available

On-site coaching will be provided to embed practices learned from workshop in instructional routines. The impact of training on outcomes and changing practice is well documented. "To put ideas…into action requires having an intention to change, having knowledge of what successful change would look like, and having a safe opportunity to trial any new teaching methods.
