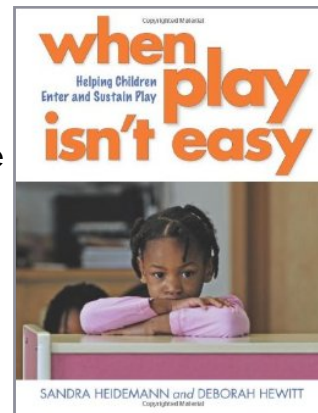
Helping Children Enter and Sustain Play
