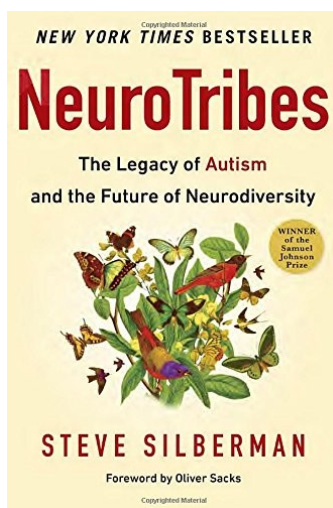

The CDC's 2016 report stated that statistically, 1 in 68 children have been diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (April, 2016).
