Want to know more about how students in your district are thinking and acting?

This effective survey assesses local attitudes and student behaviors, identifying emerging issues before they become widespread. Results can be compared with state and national trend data and shared with local non-profit and governmental organizations to develop community-wide response plans.



PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Data Retreat on Behavior Sources

This is an opportunity for your team to delve into the data related to behavior, learn to use it effectively and look for possible solutions. Data that is available to your school includes: YRBS, discipline, tardies, suspension and expulsions.

Youth Mental Health First Aid

In the Youth Mental Health First Aid course, you will learn risk factors and warning signs for mental health and addiction concerns, strategies for how to help someone in both crisis and non-crisis situations, and where to turn for help. The course is 8 hours and includes a resource book.

QPR Training (Question, Persuade, and Refer)

QPR is a one hour presentation where you will learn the signs of suicide and three basic principles of how to help save a life. QPR is designed for students, faculty and staff. A QPR session can also be arranged at a convenient time specifically for your group.

Interventions the Safe and Civil Model

Based on the book, Interventions: Evidence-Based Behavioral Strategies for Individual Students, by Randy Sprick, PhD, found: Safe & Civil Schools, this training is aimed at assisting teachers, counselors, paraprofessionals, and others who work with students who struggle with chronic misbehaviors, in the planning and implementing of validated, tiered strategies to increase motivation and improve behavior

Honest, Open, Proud: To Eliminate the Stigma of Mental Illness

Our goal is to consider the choices we have when it comes to disclosing or talking about our experiences with mental health challenges with others.
