The Nonviolent Crisis Intervention® program is a safe, non harmful behavior management system designed to help educational and human services professionals provide the best possible Care, Welfare, Safety and Security of disruptive, assaultive, and out-of-control individuals.

The new enhanced NVCI programing provides the same core program, now with additional content and new physical intervention options.

Note: All training will be the Enhanced Training content. Due to CPI quality standards, trainers will no longer be teaching the legacy version of the NVCI content.

**Prerequisite:** Participants must have attended an initial or refresher Nonviolent Crisis Intervention training within the past 18 months.

#### **Workshop Objectives:**

- ➤ Identify the appropriate measures to avoid, decelerate and/or de-escalate a crisis situation.
- > Assess the level of risk associated with a crisis situation and intervene appropriately
- ➤ Manage behavioral risk by learning disengagement and/or holding skills
- > Describe the potential impact that crisis situations have on individuals and staff.
- > Explain the importance of providing person-centered, proactive services

#### Who should attend?

Professionals, such as teachers, administrators, teaching assistants, social workers, counselors, psychologists, etc., working with students with challenging behaviors within school and community settings. Note: This training is not recommended for parents.
