Leveled Literacy Intervention (LLI) is small group, supplemental literacy intervention for students in grades K–12 who have difficulty with reading and writing. Reading Recovery® is recommended for the lowest first grade students. In Kindergarten through Grade 2, the children selected for the Leveled Literacy Intervention are the lowest achievers in literacy in their grade level and are not receiving another intervention.

THIS WORKSHOP SERIES IS A GOOD FIT FOR:

Teachers (Classroom, Title I, Special Education, ELL) of struggling readers in grades K—2, Literacy Coaches, Reading Specialists, and Interventionists.
