Educators recognize the need for timely, effective nonviolent interventions with students who exhibit challenging behaviors. They know that such interventions improve the physical safety of all participants and create a more trusting and caring learning environment.

The Nonviolent Crisis Intervention[®] (NVI) program is a safe, non-harmful behavior management system designed to help educational and human services professionals provide the best possible care, welfare, safety and security of disruptive, assaultive and out-of-control individuals. The new, enhanced NVCI programming provides the same core program, now with additional content and new physical intervention options.

OBJECTIVES

- Identify the potential for aggressive or disruptive behaviors.
- Identify the appropriate measures to avoid, decelerate and/or de-escalate a crisis situation.
- Assess the level of risk associated with a crisis situation and intervene appropriately.
- Manage behavioral risk by learning disengagement and/or holding skills.
- Describe the potential impact that crisis situations have on individuals and staff.
- Explain the importance of providing person-centered, proactive services.
