

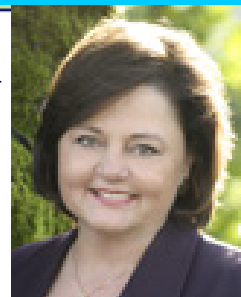


# Reaching New Heights With Nonfiction Writing
