WISCONSIN ALTERNATE ASSESSMENT FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES TRAINING

During the 2010-11 school year, the **Wisconsin Alternate Assessment for Students with Disabilities** will be administered during the same testing window as the WKCE. Special education teachers, who are required to administer the WAA-SwD, must complete training in order to administer this assessment correctly.

Three half-day training sessions are being offered for special education teachers who will be administering the WAA-SwD for the first time. Special education teachers who would benefit from an opportunity to attend another training session are also invited to attend. Teachers will be introduced to the **Wisconsin Extended Grade Band Standards** and **Performance Descriptors**. They will also learn the procedures that must be followed for the administration of the **Wisconsin Alternate Assessment for Students with Disabilities**.
