Course Description

The SIOP training at CESA 10 will guide teachers and/or administrators to support English Learners at the universal level of classroom support. Participants will learn about the eight components of SIOP and how using this protocol can impact student learning.

When implemented with fidelity, SIOP based instruction has shown to increase the language of English Language Learners and children from low socio-economic status.

Student Learning Objectives

Upon completion of this class, the following primary objectives will be met:

- a. Participants will learn the 8 components of the SIOP Model
- b. Participants will practice writing language objectives to support content objectives
- c. Participants will create a plan of how to implement the strategies into their practice

Course instructors design instructional and reflective strategies and activities that require the application and analysis of job-embedded learning, where teachers engage in additional inquiry-based professional learning related to the student learning objectives.

Assessment of Student Performance

Throughout the course, the learner will be assessed on the completion of the following assessments:

For one (1) graduate credit

1. Participants will read the book [Making Content Comprehensible for English 1. Learners: The SLOP Model](#) and provide a one page reflection of the training and how embedding SLOP strategies into content lessons can positively impact student learning. (a, b, c)
2. Participants will submit twenty-five language objective that support lessons they teach.(a,b,c)
3. Participants will submit a SMART goal that outlines who they will implement the SLOP within their instruction/school. (c)
4. Participants will arrange for Kristen Gundry to view one SLOP lesson. The date needs to be set prior to end of the course. The visit will occur in October 2015. (a,b)

The criteria for the learner demonstrations will be processed with learners prior to the instructional activities and learner engagement with the course outcomes.

Grading Policies

The grade of "I" (Incomplete) may or may not be given by the instructor at the student's request when the required work is not completed.
