Positive Behavioral Intervention and Supports (PBIS) is a systemic approach to proactive, school-wide discipline based on a Response to Intervention (RtI) model. PBIS applies evidence-based programs, practices and strategies for all students to increase academic performance, improve safety, decrease problem behavior, and establish a positive school culture. Schools implementing PBIS build on existing strengths, complementing and organizing current programming and strategies.

The PBIS model has been successfully implemented in thousands of schools in over 40 states, resulting in dramatic reductions in disciplinary interventions and increases in academic achievement. Data-based decision making is a hallmark of PBIS, allowing successes to be easily shared with all relevant stakeholders.

### Four Elements of PBIS:

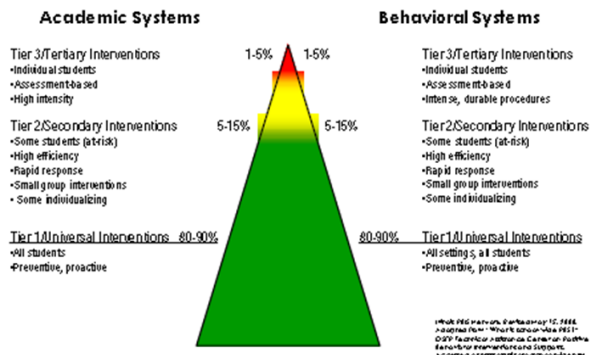
**Systems:** Policies, procedures, and decision-making processes that consider school-wide, classroom, and individual student systems.

**Data:** Guide decision-making processes and measure outcomes.

**Practices:** Strategies and programs that are used to enhance student learning outcomes and teacher instructional approaches.

**Outcomes:** Academic and behavioral targets that are measured using the gathered data.

School-Wide Systems for Student Success:  
A Response to Intervention (RtI) Model



**Content:** Participants will revisit essential school-wide systems (data, teaching, acknowledgment, and interventions) and use the *Team Implementation Checklist* to self-assess current implementation and action plans around identified needs. In addition, participants will look at the Benchmarks of Quality to begin to understand the use of the tool in self-evaluation.

Teams will Network and share successes, initial data, and ideas from their individual kick-offs. Team work will be provided for teams to work on specific areas they choose with support, resources, and guidance from PBIS trainer and CESA 6 staff.

### Who Should Attend?

Building Level Teams who participated in the two day universal training.

### Teams Should Bring:

- School calendar and staff development days
- All artifacts/products from U100s and U200s such as behavioral matrix, cool tools, behavioral lesson plans, acknowledgement system, T-chart of behavior, "working smarter" grid
- PBIS Manual received at Universal Team Training
- ODR Baseline data and Big 5 graphs from 1st month of implementation
- Summary of Evaluations from the kick-off.

4. Receive technical assistance from PBIS Network in developing and planning for implementation of school-wide system.
