

PRESS is a framework for literacy in elementary grades within a multi-tiered system of supports (MTSS). Developed through a research partnership at the Minnesota Center for Reading Research, University of Minnesota, under the direction of Drs. Matt Burns and Lori Helman, the goal of PRESS is to work with educators to establish school-based systems and practices for all K-5 students to become capable readers. PRESS complements a school's literacy curriculum and can be used with a variety of assessment programs.
