## Non-Violent Crisis Intervention Refresher

Prerequisite: Must have attended a 2-day Non-Violent Crisis Intervention Workshop previously.



Educators recognize the need for timely, effective nonviolent intervention with potentially violent individuals. They know that such intervention improves the physical safety of all participants and creates a more trusting and caring learning environment.

Anyone who may have to manage the verbally or physically aggressive individuals will benefit from the skills and techniques learned in Non-Violent Crisis Intervention.

- 1. Identify the potential for violent or disruptive behaviors
- 2. Reduce tensions
- 3. Prevent violent episodes
- 4. Intervene safely in violent situations

- 6. Improve staff confidence and boost morale
- 7. Provide optimum care for individuals
