Audience: Building level teams including building administrators, external and internal coaches, regular education teacher leaders representing different grade levels, special education teacher, social worker, school psychologist, paraprofessional and parents.

Presenter: Gary Mulry is in his 30th year in the field of education. Gary has been a regular and special educator as well as elementary principal. He is currently the Positive Behavior Support Specialist for Appleton overseeing the entire PBIS process in addition to overseeing EBD elementary programming for the district. The AASD has eighteen schools implementing PBIS this school year. Gary is a Universal PBIS Trainer for the state of Wisconsin and teaches graduate classes at Viterbo University. Gary's enthusiasm for PBIS is contagious!

Description: There are two required team work days to begin developing the knowledge, skill and materials needed for implementation:

Day 1: Participants will overview the systems, data and practices embedded in PBIS implementation. Staff evaluation of the discipline support processes are explored. The team drafts school-wide behavioral expectations, creates a behavioral matrix, and plans for team development.

Day 2: Participants build on their work from Day 1 to develop an acknowledgement plan, develop a chart of office-managed vs. classroom-managed behaviors, establish procedures for a continuum of interventions, evaluate the efficiency of "working smarter" among school teams, and create a system for effective meetings.

Teams should bring: school based behavioral data and office discipline referral form

Graduate credit: One college credit through UW Oshkosh for an additional fee of \$200.00 per participant. Participate must attend both days.

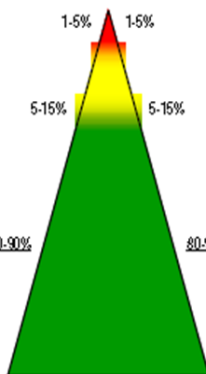
