An active shooter is an individual actively engaged in killing or attempting to kill people in a confined or populated area. Often these events are unpredictable and they always evolve very quickly. On average, it takes law enforcement 3 minutes to respond to the scene of an active shooter. What is done before these events and during those 3 minutes is critical in the outcome of an active shooter event!
