Description

Educators recognize the need for timely, effective nonviolent intervention with students who exhibit challenging behaviors. They know that such intervention improves the physical safety of all participants and creates a more trusting and caring learning environment.

Anyone who may have to manage verbally or physically aggressive individuals will benefit from the skills and techniques learned in Nonviolent Crisis Intervention. The content of this workshop addresses the Act 125 requirements regarding the appropriate use of seclusion and restraint.

This training is a full NVCI training which certifies participant for one full year by the CPI Institute. It is a longer training day and participants must attend the full day to be certified.

Workshop objectives

- Identify the potential for violent or disruptive behaviors.
- Reduce tensions.
- Learn to prevent violent episodes.
- Intervene safely in violent situations.
- Develop safe humanistic approaches to crisis intervention.
- Improve staff confidence and boost morale.
- Learn techniques to provide optimum care for individuals.
- Identify the new requirements regarding the use of seclusion and restraint in Wisconsin.

Who should attend?

Regular and special education professionals working with students with challenging behaviors, including teachers, paraprofessionals, principals, school counselors, social workers, psychologists and other educational specialists.
