DESCRIPTION

If we were referring to body parts, a **leg** is something you stand on; it gives you support. In the virtual world of Wisconsin Virtual School, a LEG is someone who gives support to students in the district who are taking virtual courses online through WVS.

Our experience at Wisconsin Virtual School (WVS) is that it is critical to the success of most students in an online environment to have someone monitoring their progress, locally. If the student had difficulty being motivated to do assignments in a traditional educational setting, he or she may have equal difficulty being motivated to do online course work. In an online course, the student must complete assignments and communicate with the teacher on a regular basis in order to complete the course. Many students need a little prodding to be sure they are moving forward toward course completion.
