Why Address Anti-Gay Bullying and Behavior?

- ◆ 4 out of 5 targets of anti-gay name calling and harassment identify as heterosexual.
- ◆ Anti-gay bullying has played a significant role in recent suicides and violence at the middle & high school levels.
- ◆ Students who are harassed because they are PERCEIVED to be lesbian, gay, or bisexual are more likely to engage in high-risk behavior.
