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Social Relation Skills and Strategies for Students With High Functioning Autism and Asperger's Syndrome

This workshop was developed as a foundation workshop to thoroughly explore the features and characteristics that comprise Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD) including Asperger Syndrome and High Functioning Autism. Numerous examples of "behaviors" in relation to the features and characteristics of ASD will be given. This foundation workshop is a priority for professionals and family members to develop an understanding of ASD from which to develop appropriate programming and intervention strategies.

This training will address the following:

- Define the various features and characteristics of social relation differences.
- Identify the educational implications, including suggestions for IEP writing, for social understanding differences for students with Asperger's Syndrome/High Functioning Autism.
- Identify strategies to enhance development of social relation skills for people with Asperger's Syndrome/High Functioning Autism.
