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DESCRIPTION

Too often, play is set in direct opposition to work, when in reality, play is the engine of learning for children. This session will help teachers reclaim a playful and joyful spirit by teaching the myriad of ways play can be used to facilitate social emotional and academic growth. This session will outline the ways play can be infused within a day, as well as the instructional strategies teachers can utilize to support children's learning. Charts and tools will be shared alongside lessons that can be used in classrooms. Teachers will see demonstrations and photographs of how a playful spirit can extend to any teaching by utilizing student interests, props, videos, and joy.

THE OUTCOMES

Participants will learn how strategies like focused lessons, conferring, small group play, and whole class conversations can build literacy skills, STEM skills, and critical social emotional skills, including developing a growth mindset. Participants will leave this workshop with the tools they need to maximize lessons, classroom setups, tools and charts, curriculum connections, teaching points, and teaching language to foster mature play that makes every moment in the classroom instructional.
