

FACTS ABOUT LEAD

- Since 1996, more than 44,000 Wisconsin children age six and younger were identified with lead poisoning.
- Nearly 1 in 20 Wisconsin third graders in 2009 were known to have been lead poisoned.
- A child with lead poisoning usually does not look or act sick; the only way to know if a child has been lead poisoned is through a blood test.
- Third graders who have been lead poisoned score 14 percent lower on reading and math performance tests, on average.
- Children who are lead poisoned are more likely to suffer as adults from kidney disease, diabetes, Alzheimer's, and early death from stroke, heart attacks, and high blood pressure.

REFRESHER COURSES

After April 22, 2012, Lead Safe Renovators who have reached their two-year training due date will be eligible to take a refresher course, which will extend the next due date an additional four years.

For instance, a person who took the initial training class July 15, 2010, currently has a due date of July 15, 2014. This person will become eligible to take the Refresher class any time after July 15, 2012. Doing so will extend the person's next training due date to July 15, 2018.

WHY ATTEND?

Lead poisoning is a preventable disease. It is prevented primarily through the removal or control of lead paint dust hazards. In 2009, Wisconsin's Department of Health Services announced new lead rules that comply with the EPA's **Renovation, Repair & Painting Rule (RRP)**. This rule was enacted to protect young children during renovation activities in facilities built prior to 1978 when lead was banned from paint. The rule requires that people who disturb lead-based paint must be lead-safe certified and follow specific work practices to prevent lead contamination.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

At least one person from each school district is required to complete this course if they maintain a child-occupied facility built prior to 1978 and will be disturbing 6 sf internally, 20 sf externally or any windows. This could include a classroom or daycare facility. After this person is trained, they will be able to train other maintenance personnel at their district.
