Module 1: *August 14* - Reader's Workshop Overview and Kick-Off: Building Routines for Successful engagement; Explore units of study that meet the standards and reach all learners.

Module 2: *August 15* -Writer's Workshop Overview and Kick-Off: Building routines that develop writers. Planning across the year to meet standards and grow writers.
