Early life experiences are the foundational building blocks for development, learning and health throughout a person's lifetime. Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and traumatic events can have a long-term negative effect on well-being, behaviors and functioning for children, adults and families.

The purpose of training is to improve professional awareness and understanding of ACE impact on child behaviors and functioning in the classroom. This training will increase the professional's ability to support children and adults who have experienced traumatic events through supportive trauma-informed strategies and services.
