Workshop Description: Through video-taped lessons and simulations, participants will collaboratively develop a working understanding of how Doug Fisher and Nancy Frey use reading and writing strategies in highly diverse secondary schools to achieve a first-time pass rate of more than 90% on the California State High School Graduation Competency Exam. The state average for first-time pass rate is about 65%.
