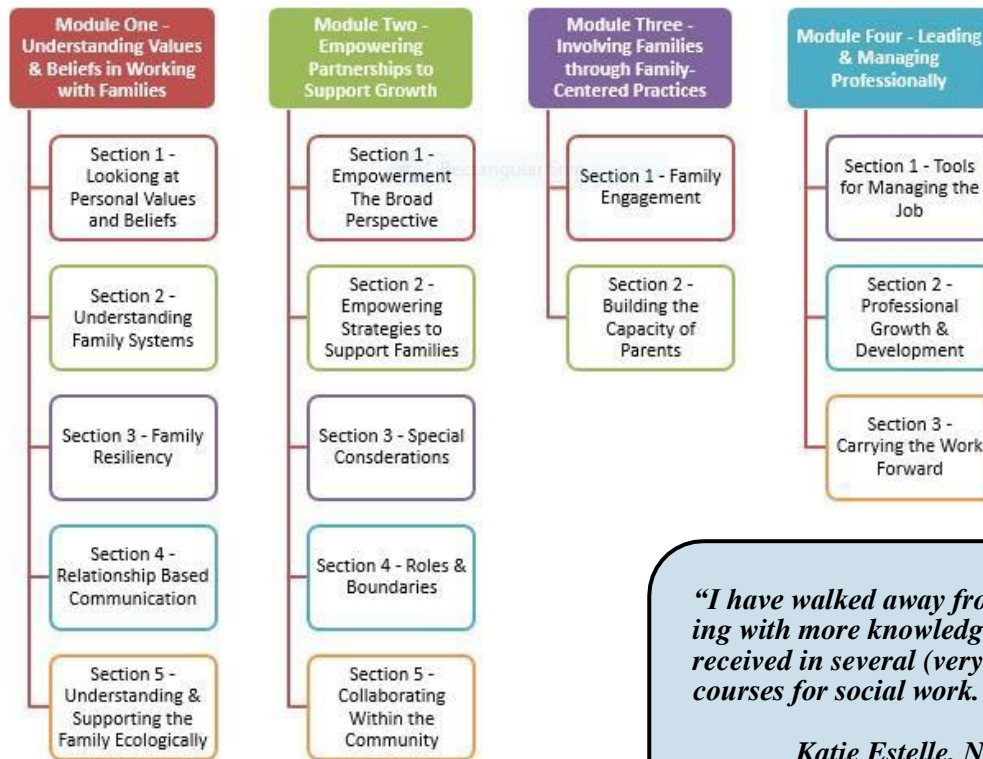

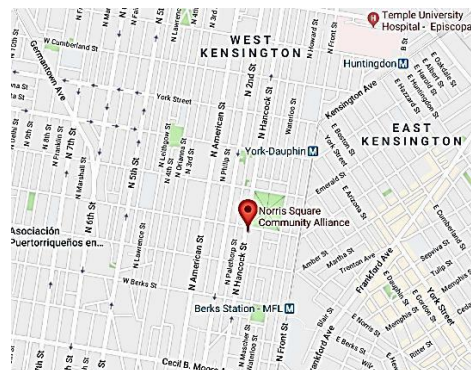
- Enhance understanding & application of content through ongoing networking & dialogue with other participants
