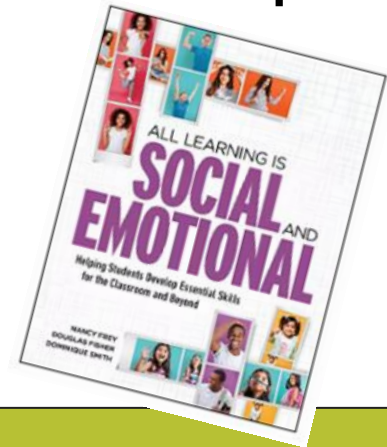


“All Learning is Social and Emotional” *with* Dominique Smith
