Instructional Moves to Help Students Access Challenging Text February 12, 2020

One of the greatest challenges facing middle and high schools is ensuring students have the comprehension strategies needed to cope in the increasingly complex world of print.

In order to access such material, readers need to be skilled at close or deep reading. This session will focus on the moves the teacher makes in order to help students access complex text and develop deep understanding. *and writing about informational text.*

College Ready Writers (With a Focus on Argumentative Writing) Summer 2020 - Dates TBD

Educators will work with resources from the National Writing Projects College, Career, and Community Writers Program (C3WP) that support students in reading critically, exploring multiple points of view, and taking their own stand on important issues.

Writing is an essential skill in modern American society. It is crucial to careers and civic engagement. Yet U.S. students' writing falls far short of national expectations. States have adopted new standards to increase the chances that students will graduate from high school prepared for college and careers, but most students are not yet receiving instruction that is aligned with those standards.

CRWP was initially designed in 2012 to support secondary teachers in high-poverty rural school districts in 10 states. With a specific emphasis on improving students' skill in writing arguments based on nonfiction texts, the results indicate that this project is worth replicating in CESA 8.
