

PBIS Administrative Overview

Tier II/Tier III AA1241-November 8, 2011

Description: This full day training provides an administrative overview of the system structures and commitments needed for effective implementation of Tier II/III of school-wide PBIS, including a description of the Tier II/III practices, data tools and fidelity measures. Emphasis is on the continuum of support across a 3-tiered system, highlighting data tools and behavioral interventions for groups of students and individuals, who require more than universal interventions to succeed.

District and school-level leaders need to have a complete understanding of what the PBIS Tier II/III systems, data and practices entail so they can provide the necessary guidance to school staff as they move through Tier II and Tier III training and implementation. Repositioning of personnel to coach and facilitate specific PBIS Tier II and Tier III components become necessary at these levels. Administrators must be aware of needed roles/functions for Tier II/III implementation so they can anticipate and plan accordingly.

coaches/specialized services personnel such as social workers and school psychologists
