Participants will be required to complete the online portion of the FLEX-NVCI training PRIOR to attending the classroom portion. NO ONE WILL BE ALLOWED TO ATTEND THE CLASSROOM TRAINING WITHOUT FIRST COMPLETING THE ONLINE PORTION. NO EXCEPTION WILL BE ALLOWED. Once registered for this training, participants will receive an e-mail from CPI stating how to complete the online portion two weeks prior to the n-person date. The online training should take between 2.5-3.5 hours.

Workshop Objectives:

- Identify the potential for aggressive or disruptive behaviors.
- Identify the appropriate measures to avoid, decelerate and/or de-escalate a crisis situation.
- Assess the level of risk associated with a crisis situation and intervene appropriately.
- Manage behavioral risk by learning disengagement and/or holding skills.
- Describe the potential impact that crisis situations have on individuals and staff.
- Explain the importance of providing person-centered, proactive services.

Who should attend:

Professionals, such as teachers, administrators, teaching assistants, social workers, counselors, psychologists, etc., working with students with challenging behaviors within school and community settings. *Note: This training is not recommended for parents.*
