Through student examples and classroom video, Stephanie will show us how to create a culture where thoughtfulness, creativity, and collaboration can prompt powerful inquiry. Adapting structures you already know, she will share a proven, authentic approach to:

- o Create irresistible investigations in science, history and social studies, and language arts;
- o Increase independence and agency by gradually releasing responsibility for inquiry; and,
- \circ Effectively integrate literacy and content through strategies for comprehension and critical thinking.
