DAVE LUDY, principal of Stanley-Boyd Middle School in Stanley, Wisconsin, is focused on helping small rural school districts implement a quality PLC and focus the school culture on student learning.

At Stanley-Boyd School District, Dave has served as principal at every level (PK-12) and helped lead the district's improvement efforts. Once the worst-performing district in its 30-school CESA, Stanley-Boyd is now near the top. He also led the high school and middle school to be nationally recognized as Model PLC Schools.

Dave understands the challenges small rural school districts with high levels of poverty face on a daily basis. He is a hands-on principal who loves to be involved with his students and works with his staff to meet the ever-changing needs of students in poverty. Dave worked with his faculty to create a culture of collaboration around data analysis in teams of singleton teachers. In addition, he created schedules with built-in collaboration, intervention, enrichment, and common prep times for his staff and students.

Dave earned his bachelor's degree in elementary education and a master's degree in educational leadership from Winona State; his specialist certificate from Concordia University of Wisconsin.
