Rather than trying to include a few students who are different, we are striving to teach TO the difference. This full-day workshop will target design strategies that support including ALL learners in collaborative ways.



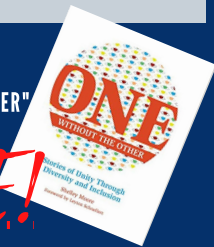

Her first book entitled, "One Without the Other" was released in July 2016 to follow up her TEDx talk hosted in Langley in January 2016. Shelley completed an undergraduate degree in Special Education at the University of Alberta, her masters at Simon Fraser University, and is currently a SSHRC funded PhD candidate at the University of British Columbia. Her research has been featured at national and international conferences, and she is also the recent recipient of the Engagement award, a national competition highlighting SSHRC funded research through story.
