Making the Most of Feedback: Supporting Multilingual Learners in a Virtual Classroom

DESCRIPTION: Feedback ranks as a highly impactful effective teaching practice (Effect size of .75 in Hattie's Visual Learning). Providing the right feedback to students learning English can be particularly challenging, yet highly rewarding, especially in virtual classrooms. In this hour-long interactive webinar, participants will be introduced to key principles for impactful feedback specific to the needs of multilingual learners. We'll explore examples of effective and ineffective feedback and apply the principles shared in the webinar.
