DPI's Statewide Reporting System: Transforming the Data Landscape in Wisconsin Schools

Description

Turning data into information that educators can act on quickly and easily is a priority for principals, administrators, and DPI alike. As part of DPI's ongoing effort to support data use and research that improves educational outcomes, the Department of Public Instruction purchased a suite of tools called business intelligence (BI) tools—that will change the way DPI reports data to schools and districts; and the way school and district staff, as well as the public, can access data about Wisconsin public schools.
