Data privacy and online student safety may sound daunting and technical. Educators can do simple, important things to protect student data and create safe places for online learning. Students are safer when all educators take responsibility instead of waiting for the school district to provide all the protection. During this micro-course, educators will learn how to:

- Evaluate and reconfigure or eliminate any app, website, product, or service that does not protect student data.
- Teach students digital safety skills to protect themselves in online environments.
- Teach students what to do when they encounter inappropriate content online.
