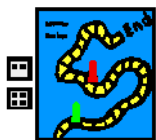
Are you amazed at all the uses for pictures and symbols to communicate, as well as, label and organize your students world?

This workshop will provide a hands-on lab experience in using the software, Boardmaker, to create communication displays, labels, games, classroom materials and schedules. Boardmaker is a graphic database containing over 3000 Picture Communication Symbols in clip art form. Each symbol is paired with the written word and foreign languages are also available. The program allows you to make professional looking communication displays or schedules in minutes. Classroom materials can also be individualized to meet students needs using this program. The workshop will also highlight intervention techniques to incorporate the communication symbols into literacy, play and social skill activities.

What to Bring:

Ideas or lists to make boards, schedules, etc. as there will be time to practice what you've learned. If you want to save the material you work on bring a flash drive.
