Ford has co-authored five nationally published books as well as made contributions to many others. He has published thirty-five refereed journal articles and is senior author of a core reading program for elementary classrooms. Ford's service is reflected in his professional involvement with local districts, schools, organizations and educators and the more than 400 professional development presentations he's given throughout the country and on international campuses.
