COACHING LIGHT TO COACHING HEAVY [FEBRUARY 16]

Change is hard. Coaches who have strong partnerships and trusting, productive relationships with their clients, grounded in solid partnership agreements, can help their clients push through the pain of change to achieve their best selves and exceptional practice. In this session, coaches will explore how to strengthen their partnership agreements, build the trust necessary for deep change, and address the not-yet-readiness some clients manifest.
