## Overview

Spotlight Schools is a competitive grant program for 2010-11 Wisconsin Schools of Recognition that have received the award for the last three (or more) consecutive years. Spotlight Schools were selected based on the school's documented success in two spotlighted areas including Teaching and Learning and one of the following: Vision, Leadership and Governance, Decision Making and Accountability, Professional Development and Teacher Quality, and Family, School, and Community Partnerships.

Schools selected as Spotlight Schools are required to host at least three schools on a one-day visit to observe and discuss spotlighted practices; to share spotlighted practices regionally and statewide; and to provide professional development or other school improvement opportunities to improve current school practice.

- How could our district make use of the decisions made by the Spotlight Schools?
- How could our district implement some of the programs put into place by the Spotlight Schools?
