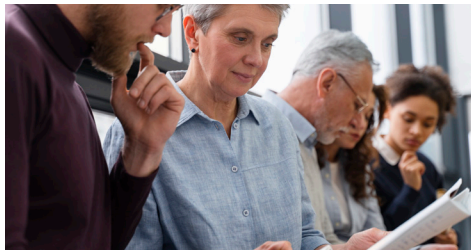




Restorative Practices District Training

Restorative Practices focus on building a community, resolving conflict, repairing harm and healing relationships. Restorative Practices offer an alternative to traditional disciplinary actions that often lead to disproportionately punishing students from marginalized groups. Educators, leaders, and parents are encouraged to take part in this training.
