RITE PROGRAM FEE AGREEMENT STATEMENTS PREVIEW

- RITE Application Fee and RITE Program Deposit are non-refundable.
- Acknowledgement of additional costs and fees are associated with the program.
- Commitment to pay RITE Service Fees as scheduled. In the event of late payment, proactive and timely communication to RITE Coordinator required.
- Candidate withdrawal RITE Service Fees are handled in the following ways RITE Calendars: 2022-2023 & 2023-2024
 - BEFORE first scheduled class candidate is reimbursed 100% of semester fee paid.
 - On or before the DROP date candidate is reimbursed 80% of semester fee paid.
 - After DROP date, no refund. Candidate is responsible for Service Fees for the entire current semester. \$0 reimbursed.
- Candidate dismissal no reimbursement. Candidate is responsible for Service Fees for the entire current semester.
- By signing the RITE Program Agreement, candidate agrees to pay all costs associated with enrollment. Furthermore, candidate agrees to pay all collection expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees, which CESA 6 may incur if payment obligations are not fulfilled.

LICENSE OVERVIEW

- Open to ANY college major meeting Content Knowledge Requirements
- License to teach Grades 4K 9th, any grade level, any subject

2800: Elementary - Middle Education (K-9): The license allows the holder to teach any subject in a self-contained classroom, except a foreign language, within the grade level as specified on the license. A license in Regular Education or Elementary Education also allows the license holder to teach the following subjects in a departmentalized or other school organization pattern within the grade as specified on the license: language arts, mathematics, science, social studies, and health. SPECIAL EDUCATION: CROSS-CATEGORICAL (K-12)

LICENSE OVERVIEW

- Open to ANY college major meeting Content Knowledge Requirements
- License to teach Grades 4K 12th, age 21 students with an IEP

2801: Cross-Categorical Special Education (K-12): The license allows the holder to provide special education services to a student with a disability per the individual student IEP within the grade level of the license (K-12). The exception is for student IEPs that require the following services: occupational therapy, physical therapy, speech-language, audiology, orientation & mobility, visual impairment (VI), deaf or hard of hearing (DHH), and educational interpreter. Guidelines for Residency



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RITE LE is a customized program for licensed educators looking to EXTEND their current license in grade levels and/or subject. Successful completion of RITE LE requirements leads to earning an additional license with the broader range. Grade/Developmental Level Requirements

RITE LE programming typically takes 2 semesters. Classes are held in a variety of modalities: online via Zoom, independent study modules, and in-person classes held at CESA 6 - one weekend per month. RITE Calendars: 2022-2023 and 2023-2024

Residency work can be completed on-the job or in one of the other Residency I options presented on previous pages in this packet. Supplemental Grade Level Experience is required when completing EXTENSION programming to meet additional grade levels of new license.

ADMISSION PROCESS OVERVIEW



BACHELOR'S DEGREE*

Applicants must hold one of the following:

- Bachelor's Degree (or higher) from a regionally accredited college or university
- Credential evaluation confirming the equivalent of a bachelor's degree earned outside the United States

*Experience-Based Technical & Vocational Licensed Teachers are not required to have a Bachelor's degree

FOUNDATIONAL SKILLS

Applicants must have **ONE** of the following:

- Undergraduate 2.75 GPA or higher OR cumulative Master's degree GPA of 3.0 or higher on four-point scales as demonstrated on official transcripts
- Qualifying Test scores (ACT, SAT, Praxis I CORE, PPST, or GRE)
- **Demonstration of academic growth** See Content Knowledge Worksheet for more information

 - Official Score Report, as needed, for ACTFL or Praxis II.
- Complete Background Screening Process when registration and application are complete.

SUBSTITUTE TEACHER TRAINING

The CESA 6 RITE Program substitute teacher training will teach and engage prospective substitute teachers in activities that mirror real classroom situations.

To be issued a three-year, short-term, substitute teacher license an individual must hold an Associate's degree or higher and receive DPI approved training. CESA 6 training is geared to those NEW to Substitute Teaching and/or those interested in growing their skills as a Substitute Teacher for work throughout Wisconsin.
