

21st Century Learning Possibilities – Mobile Tools in a Flexible Learning Environment

Classroom technology is no longer tethered to the desktop computer. Learning, research, exploration, analysis, observation, access and more can now take place on the fly, accessed from multiple devices and locations at once. The focus of this hands-on session will be utilizing mobile classroom devices such as iPads, iPods, Smart Phones, wi-fi enabled microscopes and document cameras, applications for mobile devices that support students with disabilities (and more!) that can be accessed from and/or transferred between web applications, portable devices and other emerging technologies. Participants will learn how to integrate iPods, iPads into the classroom with a variety of connecting technologies. Free or inexpensive software will be used to create polls, tests and quizzes that can either be “pushed” immediately to mobile devices wirelessly, or accessed later through computers. Participants are encouraged to bring their own iPod or iPad.
