This TWO-DAY, TEAM-BASED workshop provides elementary school leadership teams with the fundamental knowledge and resources to develop their school's Rtl system

Who Should Attend

- Elementary School-level leadership teams of three or more, to include:
- Principal (essential)
- General education and special education teachers
- Specialists in the content area (either mathematics or reading) addressed by the school during this workshop. Examples include • reading specialist, Title One mathematics instructors, pupil services, gifted and talented coordinator, etc...

Outcomes

Teams will leave with:

- · An in-depth understanding of Wisconsin's vision for Response to Intervention (Rtl)
- Take-away activities, materials, and resources to support staff awareness, buy-in, and implementation of Wisconsin's Rtl framework
- A map and baseline assessment of their elementary school's current Rtl framework implementation in either reading or mathematics
- An Rtl action plan linked to existing school improvement goals and actions for either reading or mathematics
- Complete a baseline assessment of your school's Rtl implementation using the School-wide Implementation Review.

What to Bring

Due to the interactive nature of this training, school leadership teams should bring:

- A laptop with wireless connectivity
- A data projector
- The school's improvement goals and plans
- Student achievement goals and/or school-level trend data for either reading or mathematics (e.g. aggregated and disaggregated WKCE or benchmark assessment results).
