This course will introduce to school personnel the concepts of restorative justice and restorative discipline; offer new tools that can reduce the need for school exclusion; and offer ways to enhance the school environment to prevent conflict and restore relationships after conflict arises.

Workshop Objectives

- Learn the concepts of Restorative Justice as they apply to the school setting.
- Provide ways to effectively address behavior and other complex school issues.
- How to create a supportive environment that can improve learning.
- How to improve safety by preventing future harm .
- Offer alternatives to suspension and expulsion.
