Dr. Hyson will discuss using data to understand common academic problems, planning interventions, and effective progress monitoring. In addition to addressing how school psychologists can help regular and special education staff connect data to intervention, Dr. Hyson will also address how school psychologists can play a role in managing data at a broader level, can help teams more efficiently make sense of multiple sources and forms of data, and can use technology to access, organize, analyze and present data.
