

Comprehension and Collaboration: Inquiry Circles

Presenter: Stephanie Harvey

About the Presenter: Stephanie Harvey has spent the past thirty years teaching and learning about reading and writing. She received her B.A. from the University of Denver and her M.A. from the University of Colorado. After fifteen years of regular elementary and special education teaching in Lakewood, Colorado, Stephanie became a staff developer for the Denver-based Public Education and Business Coalition (PEBC).

She is a teacher first and foremost and continues to work in schools on a regular basis. Stephanie also serves as a private consultant to schools and districts throughout the country, working with educators in inner-city, suburban, and rural districts. In addition, Stephanie is a regular presenter and keynote speaker at conferences.

Each summer she offers her annual Reading Is Thinking comprehension institute at different locations throughout the country. She serves on the National Geographic Society Literacy Council and has published articles in *Language Art, Instructor,* and other educational publications. Her first book, *Nonfiction Matters,* was followed by *Strategies That Work,* written in collaboration with her col-

league Anne Goudvis in 2000. In the spring of 2005, Heinemann published The *Comprehension Toolkit: Language and Lessons for Active Literacy,* a resource for reading comprehension instruction.

Recently, Stephanie and Anne have released a number of videos on reading comprehension, including a single tape called *Read Write and* Talk with a focus on active literacy, a three-tape series for English Language Learners called *Reading the* World and *Strategic Thinking*, a comprehension series aimed at middle-grade readers.

Description: Comprehension and Collaboration: Inquiry Circles in Action occurs at the intersection of comprehension, collaboration, and inquiry. This work-shop is designed for teachers who want to realize the benefits of well-structured, student-led, cross-curricular projects. Stephanie Harvey will address:

- The foundation for inquiry circles by chronicling the current research and practices behind comprehension instruction and classroom collaboration
- · Practical lessons in comprehension, collaboration, and research
- Four types of inquiry circles—mini-research projects; curricular inquiries; extensions of literature circles; and open inquiry projects
- Characteristic management concerns, such as how to use the Internet for research and how to assess and monitor student achievement.
